



February 13 - 14, 2016 and June 4-5, 2016.

On these days any person (except those whose license has been suspended or revoked) may fish without a license.

All other laws and regulations apply on these days.

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

How to Use This Book

- 1. Go to page 18 and read through the General Law bag limits, length limits, and gear restrictions that apply to all waters in the State of Maine that do not have special rules stating otherwise.
- 2. Determine which county the water you wish to fish is located in.
- 3. Go to the maps on page 19 to determine the region of the state you wish to fish. The regions are called the Southern and Eastern Counties and the Northern and Western Counties. Read through the season dates and other rules that apply to the county and the time period you wish to fish.
- 4. Search for the water you wish to fish by county beginning on either page 20 (Southern and Eastern Counties) or on page 34 (Northern and Western Counties).
- 5. If the water <u>is</u> listed, then read the special rules that are in effect. Some special rules are explained in text format, others are explained by a code consisting of bold-face letters, and others are explained by a code that begins with the letter "S" followed by a number. A table explaining all the codes is located on the inside flap of the back cover (page 66). NOTE: Be sure to check the tributary waters for any special rules, such as S-3.
- 6. If the water you wish to fish is <u>not</u> listed, then follow the statewide General Laws (page 18), the general rule season dates for either the Southern and Eastern or the Northern and Western Counties (page 19), and any special rules for each county beginning on either page 20 or page 34.

- * 1-day fishing license may be exchanged by a Maine resident for a season fishing or combination hunting and fishing license upon payment of the difference between that fee and the fee for the annual license, plus the agent's fee.
- ** Maine resident permanently stationed outside the state of Maine.
- *** Nonresident 15-day fishing license may be exchanged for a nonresident season fishing license upon payment of \$17 plus the agent's fee.

LIFETIME LICENSES

Your investment in a lifetime license for yourself or as a gift, will allow the bearer to fish, trap, and/or hunt for their lifetime, regardless of where they will live in the future. The revenues generated by the sale of these licenses will be deposited in a special trust fund that will provide long-term financial support for Maine's fish and wildlife.

NOTICE to all lifetime license holders – Anytime during the calendar year that you reach 70 years of age, the following authorities that you are qualified to receive are included as part of your lifetime license at no additional cost: bear hunt, bear trap, crossbow, muzzleload, migratory waterfowl, pheasant, turkey, coyote night hunt, one expanded archery antierless deer permit, and one expanded archery either-sex deer permit. (Does not include any-deer or moose permits).


All residents and nonresidents who operate any motorized watercraft or aircraft equipped with pontoons on inland waters must display a Lake & River Protection Sticker in addition to a current boat registration sticker.

^{*****} These fees are subject to change, please check with the department for current fees.

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LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

No resident of this state, 16 years of age or older, or nonresident, 16 years of age or older, may fish in inland waters or transport fish taken from inland waters without first obtaining a valid Maine fishing license. Maine residents* may obtain a fishing license from any resident license agent. Nonresidents** may obtain fishing licenses in person or by mail from the IF&W Department Office in Augusta or from any of the numerous nonresident license agents throughout the state. Residents and nonresidents are also able to purchase licenses on our website mefishwildife.com.

A person is required to keep his/her fishing license with him/her at all times while fishing or transporting fish and must exhibit their license for inspection by any warden, department employee, guide or landowner upon request. An electronic license or permit can now be displayed in lieu of a physical paper license or permit.

Possession of fishing tackle in the fields or forest or on the waters or ice of this State without a fishing license is prima facie evidence of fishing in violation of the law.

The commissioner may allow a licensee who has received a complimentary fishing license to have a person accompany and assist that licensee in fishing. The person accompanying and assisting the holder of a complimentary fishing license may do so without obtaining a separate fishing license. This subsection does not authorize the person accompanying and

assisting the licensee to assist that licensee with more than one fishing rod and reel. The person accompanying and assisting the licensee must remain within the immediate proximity of the licensee while that licensee is fishing.

FREE (COMPLIMENTARY) FISHING LICENSE PROVISIONS

A free fishing license will be issued, upon application, to the following (these free licenses may be obtained at the Department Office in Augusta):

- 1. Any Maine resident who is blind;
- Any Maine Native American who is a member of the Passamaquoddy, Penobscot, Maliseet, or Micmac Tribe (must obtain licenses from their respective tribal headquarters);
- Any Maine, NH, or VT resident who is a war veteran and has a service-connected disability of 50%;
- Any Maine resident (or nonresident, if reciprocal privileges exist in the home state of the nonresident) who is suffering from the loss, or loss of use, of both lower extremities;
- Any person with a developmental disability (as defined in Title 5, §19503);
- 6. Any person with a head injury (as defined in Title 22, §3086); and
- Any resident 16 or 17 years old in the custody of the Dept. of Health and Human Services.

SPECIAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH AND ELIGIBLE COMPLIMENTARY LICENSE HOLDERS

Special fishing opportunities for youth anglers (under 16 years of age) and complimentary license-holders with physical or cognitive disabilities are indicated by the **S-9** code in the special rules sections of this lawbook, which begin on page 20. Complimentary license holders eligible to fish in S-9 waters include:

- 1. Any Maine resident who is blind;
- Any Maine, NH, or VT resident who is a war veteran and has a service-connected disability of 50%;
- 3. Any Maine resident (or nonresident, if reciprocal privileges exist in the home state of the nonresident) who is suffering from the loss, or loss of use, of both lower extremities;
- Any person with a developmental disability (as defined in Title 5, \$19503);
- 5. Any person with a head injury (as defined in Title 22, §3086), and
- Any resident 16 or 17 years old in the custody of the Dept. of Health and Human Services.

NOTE: Certain waters are reserved for fishing only by persons under 16 years of age. These waters are indicated by the S-11 code in the special rules sections of this lawbook, which begin on page 20.

RESIDENCY DEFINITIONS

*Resident means a citizen of the United States who is domiciled in this State or an alien who has been so domiciled for one year. You will not be considered a resident unless:

- if registered to vote, registered in Maine;
- if licensed to drive a motor vehicle, applied for a Maine motor vehicle license;
- if owning a motor vehicle(s) located within the State, registered each vehicle in Maine;
- complied with the State income tax laws; and
- if a full-time student at a Maine college or university, resides in Maine AND satisfies above requirements.

**Nonresident means a person who does not fall within the definition of resident.





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With more than 6,000 lakes and ponds, 3,000 miles of coastline, and 32,000 miles of rivers and streams, few states can match the magnitude of water that Maine has to offer. Which is why boating adds approximately \$150 million to the state's economy each year.


But with the scenic waterways comes a substantial number of boating accidents. According to the U.S. Coast Guard, there are approximately 5,000 recreational boating accidents in the United States annually, resulting in more than 750 fatalities and 3,500 injuries. Of the 750 deaths, on average over 500 include victims who drowned without wearing a life jacket.

At the Law Offices of Joe Bornstein, we see victims of boating accidents on a regular basis. That's why we want to help educate boaters on how to be safe when on the open water. Because when it comes to boating safety, a little education can be the difference between life and death.

- All motorized boats must carry a current registration sticker from the state.
- The age restriction for operating a personal watercraft, including a jet-ski, is 16. Boaters between the ages of 16-18 must either be accompanied by an adult or have completed an approved education course and carry proof of completion.
- Every boat should have one life jacket per passenger on board.
- Carry an emergency kit and cell phone, and be sure to tell someone where you are headed and when you expect to return.
- Slow down when near other boats, swimmers, and those enjoying the water. Your consideration will allow others to have fun and remain safe.
- Most boating accidents are alcohol-related. Like driving a car, it is illegal
 to operate a boat with a Blood Alcohol Content level over .08.
- Educate yourself on basic water safety and boating rules. The U.S. Coast Guard strongly recommends that all boat owners take an official boater education course.

By following a few simple safety tips, boaters can enjoy their time on Maine's waterways while ensuring safety for themselves and others. Because at the end of the day, knowing you had a safe and relaxing day out at sea is fun in itself, especially if you don't rock the boat.

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Advance Baiting:

It is unlawful to deposit any meat, bones, dead fish or other food material in inland waters for the purpose of luring fish. However, it is lawful to place food particles in a baitfish trap for the purpose of luring baitfish. (12657)

Alewives (migratory sea-run):

The term "alewives", when used alone, means the same as River Herring or Blueback Herring. A licensed fisherman may take 25 alewives daily from inland waters by the use of a dip net or single hook and line for consumption by himself or members of his family, except that alewives may not be taken from waters where a municipality or individual has been granted exclusive rights under laws regulating marine resources. (12506 -5-A) Exclusive rights apply to the watershed above the municipality as well as all waters within the municipality.

Artificial Lure:

Any fishing lure constructed by humans as an imitation or substitute for natural bait or fish forage and includes, but is not limited to artificial flies, spinners, spoons, poppers, plugs, jigs and plastic, rubber or other artificial imitations of natural bait. An artificial lures only rule prohibits the use of any live, dead or chemically preserved natural or organic bait or food. (12655)

Bag Limit (All Fish):

Any fish, except baitfish and smelts, taken from inland waters shall be immediately released alive into the water from which it was taken, or killed at once. Any fish killed becomes part of the daily bag limit. (12611)

Bait Containers:

A person selling bait may not provide or sell the bait in containers composed in whole or in part of polystyrene foam plastic. This does not apply to baitfish. (12553-2)

Bass:

The term "bass", when used alone, includes largemouth and smallmouth.

Brook Trout:

The term "brook trout" includes brook trout, splake, and Arctic char (Sunapee trout and blueback trout).

Closed Waters:

All inland waters, including those in Indian Territory (See page 53), are closed to ice fishing except those opened by rule.

County Lines:

Whenever county lines divide a body of water, the more liberal county rule applies to the entire body of water.

Cusk Lines:

All lines set through the ice at night (sunset to sunrise) for cusk must be checked at least once every hour by the person who set them. (12659-A-4)

Dip Net:

A device consisting of a rigid frame filled with netting, firmly attached to a rigid handle and manually operated by a single person.

Failure to Label Fish:

It is unlawful to keep bass, landlocked salmon, togue (lake trout) or trout at any sporting camp, hotel, public lodging place or any place other than a person's residence without attaching the name and address of the person who caught the fish. (12608)

Fishways:

The area within 150 feet of any operational fishway is closed to fishing. For the purposes of this subsection "operational" means a fishway capable of fish passage whether or not it is allowing the passage of fish at any given time. Exceptions to the above restriction are as follows:

- At the following places, the fishway and the area within 75 feet of any part of the fishway are closed to fishing at all times:
 - 1. Grand Falls Powerhouse Dam on St. Croix River in Baileyville.
 - 2. Woodland Dam on the St. Croix River in Baileyville.
- At the following places, the area within the fishway and within 75 feet of the downstream mouth of the fishway is closed to fishing at all times (fishing upstream from the dam at the top of the fishway is lawful):
 - East Grand Lake Dam in Forest City Twp (T9 R4 NBPP).
 - 2. Spednic Lake Dam in Vanceboro
- At the so-called ice control dam on the Narraguagus River in the Town of Cherryfield, the area within 100 feet of the dam is closed to fishing at all times.
- At the East Outlet Dam on the outlet of Moosehead Lake in Sapling Twp. (T1 R7 BKP WKR) in Somerset County and in Big Moose Twp. (T2 R6 BKP EKR) in Piscataquis County, the fishway and the area within 50 feet of any part of the fishway is closed to fishing at all times.
- At the following places, fishing is prohibited in or from the fishway; there are no distance restrictions when fishing near the fishway: Beaver Pond Dam in Seven Ponds Township in Franklin County, Chain of Ponds Dam in Chain of Ponds Township in Franklin County, Davis Pond Dam in Eddington in Penobscot County, Leonard's Mills Dam on Blackman Stream in Bradley in Penobscot County, Little Island Pond Dam in Seven Ponds Township in Franklin County, Long Pond Dam in Seven Ponds Township in Franklin County, Pushaw Lake Dam in Hudson in Penobscot County, Sheepscot Lake Dam in the Town of Palermo in Waldo County, Souadabscook Stream Dam at Grist Mill Pond in Carmel in Penobscot County, and Webber Pond Dam in Vassalboro in Kennebec County.

(Note: These provisions do not restrict the taking of alewives and smelts in accordance with laws regulating marine resources.) (12457)

Fly (Artificial Fly):

A single-pointed hook dressed with feathers, hair,

thread, tinsel, or any similar material to which no additional hook, spinner, spoon or similar device is added.

Fly Fishing:

Casting upon water and retrieving in a manner in which the weight of the fly line propels the fly. No more than 3 unbaited artificial flies individually attached to a line may be used. (12654-A) (NOTE: It is unlawful to troll a fly in waters restricted to fly fishing only.) (12658)

Free Family Fishing Days:

Will take place on February 13–14, 2016 and June 4–5, 2016. On these days, any person (except those whose license has been suspended or revoked) may fish without a license. All other laws and regulations apply on these days.

General Law:

General Law is defined as laws and rules that govern fishing in all water bodies unless there are other more specific regulations listed. More specifically, general law covers any legal terminal gear, daily bag and possession limits, season dates and species. The General Law provisions are located on page 18.

Hook:

A single fish hook constructed with 1, 2 or 3 points.

Ice Fishing:

Taking freshwater fish during the ice fishing season through man-made openings in the ice by the use of ice fishing implements. It is unlawful to open water fish in inland waters while positioned on ice. (12601)

Ice Fishing Implement:

Any lawful fishing implement used to take fish through the ice including a trap (tip-up), jig stick, rod in hand or handline, except that a person engaged in taking smelts and baitfish may do so in accordance with the laws and rules governing these activities.

Ice Fishing Shack:

A person who owns any shack or temporary structure used for ice fishing:

- Must remove, or cause to be removed, the shack or structure on the ice of any inland waters prior to ice out, or 3 days after the close of the ice fishing season.
- Shall have painted on the outside of the shack or structure in 2-inch letters, the owner's name and address when the shack or structure is on the ice of any inland waters. (12661)
- A person may not leave a structure on another person's land without permission of the landowner. (Title 17, §2263-A)

Ice Fishing Trap (Tip-Up):

An ice fishing implement for storing line, designed to be set through the ice and to indicate when something has disturbed the attached bait.

Illegal Implements, Use of:

- A. Except as otherwise provided, it is unlawful to possess any grapnel, trawl, weir, seine, gill net, trap, set line or drop net on or adjacent to any of the inland waters of this State.
- B. Except as otherwise provided, it is unlawful to fish with a grapnel, spear, spear gun, trawl, weir, gaff, seine, gill net, trap, or set lines. (12656)

Illegal Fishing:

Except as otherwise provided, it is unlawful to fish other than with a single baited hook and line, artificial flies or artificial lures and spinners.

Exception: This does not apply to hook and line smelt fishing. All other rules and regulations governing the taking of smelt apply. Use of a gaff is unlawful. (12654)

Illegal Use of Antifreeze:

Adding substances containing ethylene glycol or other antifreeze agents to waters of this State is illegal. (Title 38, §413)

Importation of Fish:

It is unlawful to import any live freshwater fish or eggs into this State without written permission from the Commissioner. (12556)

Lead Sinkers:

It is unlawful to sell, offer for sale, or use a lead sinker that weighs one ounce or less or measures 2.5 inches or less. This does not include artificial lures, or weighted line or lines, or jigs. NOTE: After September 1, 2016 the sale or offer for sale of an unpainted bare lead jig that weighs one ounce or less or measures 2.5 inches or less is prohibited and after September 1, 2017 the use of an unpainted bare lead jig that weighs one ounce or less or measures 2.5 inches or less is prohibited. (12663-B & 12664)

Line Restrictions:

Unless otherwise provided by rule, the number of lines an angler may fish at any one time is limited to two lines while open water fishing and five lines while ice fishing. At no time may an angler fish with more than five lines.

Litter:

It is unlawful to dispose of litter (including abandoned ice fishing shacks) anywhere in this State, except in areas or receptacles designed for that purpose. Convicted violators face fines up to \$500 for the first offense and up to \$2,000 for subsequent offenses.

Marking Fish:

It is unlawful to tag, fin clip, or otherwise mark any fish to be released alive into the inland waters of the State without the written consent of the Commissioner. (12601)

Minimum Legal Length:

The total length of a fish measured from the tip of the snout to the tip of the tail, with the lobes of the tail squeezed together.

Night Fishing:

Except as otherwise provided by rule, all waters open to fishing are open to fishing 24 hours a day. All lines must be under the immediate supervision of the person who set them. (Open Water Fishing - 12652, Ice Fishing - 12659-A)

Exception: All lines set through the ice at night for cusk must be checked at least once every hour by the person who set them. (12659-A-4)

Notice of Submerged Vehicle:

The owner of any motor vehicle, all terrain vehicle or snowmobile that becomes submerged, or partially submerged, in the waters of the State shall immediately notify the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife of the event and the location of the vehicle. The owner is legally liable for removal and to pay any damages resulting from the submersion or removal. Motor vehicles shall be removed within 30 days (same day if public water supply). Snowmobiles and ATVs shall be removed within 24 hours. (Title 17, §2267-A)

Open Water Fishing:

Taking freshwater fish during the open water fishing season by means of hook and line in hand, or attached to a rod, or by casting or trolling artificial flies, lures, or baited hooks, provided that the person angling does not take fish through a man made hole in the ice, from the ice or from any object supported by the ice. (12601)

Possessing Gift Fish:

A person who does not possess a valid fishing license issued under chapter 923 may not possess a fish or any part of a fish given to that person except a person may possess in that person's domicile a gift fish that was lawfully caught and is plainly labeled with the name of the person who gave the fish and the year, month and day the fish was caught by that person. This section does not apply to baitfish. (12613)

Possession Limit (All Fish):

A person shall not possess at any time more fish than may lawfully be taken in one day. (12602-2)

Railroad Track Restrictions:

A person may not, without right, stand or walk on a railroad track or railroad bridge or pass over a railroad bridge except by railroad conveyance. For penalties see Title 23, Chapter 611, § 7007.

Removal of Bag Limits on Bass:

In waters where the bag limit on bass has been removed by special rule, the season on bass and the method of fishing for them is the same as for trout and landlocked salmon.

Removal of Heads and Tails:

It is unlawful to alter the length of landlocked salmon, trout, togue, lake whitefish, and bass unless the fish are being prepared for immediate cooking. It is unlawful to possess or transport fish dressed in such a manner that the species of fish cannot be identified; unless the fish are being prepared for immediate cooking (smoking does not constitute cooking). (12601)

Sale of Certain Fish Prohibited:

It is unlawful to buy or sell, directly or indirectly, trout, togue, landlocked salmon, bass, white perch, or pickerel (except fish which have been lawfully produced by commercial producers and skins of fish which have been preserved by taxidermy). (12609-A)

Salmon:

The term "Salmon." when used alone, means the same as landlocked salmon.

Salmon Eggs As Bait:

Commercially prepared eggs from species that do not naturally occur in this State may be used for bait. (12553)

Season Dates:

All dates are inclusive.

Set Line:

A line extending into the water and rigged to catch fish that has one end secured to the shore, or to a fixed or buoyant object, that is not personally attended.

Exception: lines set through the ice for cusk at night.

Single-Baited Hook:

A single-baited apparatus designed to catch only one fish at a time.



Smelting:

A person holding a valid Maine fishing license may take smelts for recreational purposes only from the inland waters or portions of inland waters that are open to fishing and naturally free of ice with a dip net in the usual and ordinary way from noon to 2:00 a.m. in accordance with bag limits established by rule. Bag limits established by rule under this paragraph are for a 24-hour period, beginning at noon on a given day and ending at 11:59 a.m. the following day. A person may not take smelts with a dip net unless that dip net meets the requirements listed on page 12. A dip net when used to take smelts in a tributary or within 100 feet of the mouth of a tributary must contain a rigid circular frame that is not more than 24 inches in diameter as measured at any point on the hoop and manually operated by a single person. (12456)

Note: An unlimited number of baited hooks may be used on your line while fishing for smelts.

Snagging:

To fish by manipulating a hook or hooks in such a manner as to pierce or snag the fish in a part of the body other than the mouth. It is unlawful to fish for any fish, except suckers, by snagging. (12651)

Special Bag Limit:

Whenever any waters have a special bag limit, no person shall possess more than one day's bag limit taken from those waters.

Species Identification:

It is unlawful to possess or transport fish dressed in such a manner that the species of the fish cannot be identified unless the fish are being prepared for immediate cooking. (Smoking does not constitute cooking.) (12601)

Suckers:

Persons licensed, or otherwise entitled to fish, may take suckers for their own use between April 1st and June 30th from all rivers, streams and brooks open to fishing by use of a hand spear, bow and arrow or by snagging. (Note: If suckers are taken by bow and arrow, the arrow must have a barbed or pronged point and must be attached to the bow with a line.) (12506)

Supervision of Lines:

All lines must be under the immediate supervision of the person who set them. Exception: All lines set through the ice at night for cusk must be checked at least once every hour by the person who set them. (Open Water Fishing - 12652, Ice Fishing - 12659-A, Cusk Fishing - 12659-A)

Ten-Acre Ponds:

All ponds of 10 acres or less formed on rivers, streams and brooks are governed by the same fishing rule(s), *unless specifically listed for the waterbody*, that apply to the river, stream, or brook where the pond is situated, whether the pond is natural or artificial. (This does not apply to private ponds.)

Terminal Gear:

Tackle at the end of a line used to catch fish, including baited and unbaited hooks, artificial lures and baits, and artificial flies.

Thoroughfares:

Waterways connecting lakes and/or ponds. The general fishing laws governing lakes and ponds also apply to thoroughfares (includes seasons, bag limits, length limits, etc.)

To Fish:

To take, catch, kill, molest or destroy any fish or to attempt to take, catch, kill or molest or destroy any fish.

Togue:

The term "Togue" means the same as Lake Trout.

Tributary:

A river, stream, or brook flowing directly or indirectly into a lake, pond, or another river, stream, or brook. A lake or great pond shall not be construed to mean tributary. The tributary to a great pond shall not be considered a tributary to the outlet of that great pond.

Troll:

To fish by trailing a line rigged to catch fish behind or in front of a watercraft being propelled by mechanical, wind or manual power. (Tandem flies are allowed when trolling.)

Trout:

The term "trout" when used alone, includes brook trout, brown trout, rainbow trout, Arctic char (Sunapee trout and blueback trout), and splake. The term "brook trout" includes brook trout, splake and Arctic char (Sunapee trout and blueback trout).

Use of Explosive, Poisonous or Stupefying Substance:

It is unlawful to take or destroy any fish by use of an explosive, poisonous or stupefying substance. (12653)

Use of Fish (live or dead) as Bait:

See laws on page 61 concerning the use of baitfish (live or dead).

Violation of Limits:

It is unlawful to fish for or possess fish in violation of the number, amount, or size limits of any rule adopted by the Commissioner. (12602)

Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Program

The Federal Aid in Sport Fish Restoration Program is a cooperative effort involving federal and state government agencies. This program was first established in 1950 by the Dingell-Johnson Act, and then expanded considerably in 1984 through the Wallop-Breaux Amendment. The program established a "User Pay/User Benefit" philosophy for funding States' restoration and conservation efforts directed towards America's fisheries resources. Revenues are collected from excise taxes on fishing tackle, motorboat fuel sales, and import duties on tackle and boats. These monies are then allocated to state fishery agencies for sport fisheries and boating access projects.

These funds support a wide array of projects in Maine including: fisheries population assessments, lake and stream habitat assessments and restoration, acquisition and maintenance of water access sites, aquatic education, and the development of long-range species management plans.

GENERAL LAW TERMINAL GEAR

The use of all legal forms of bait, artificial lures, and artificial flies is permitted.

The daily bag, possession and minimum length limits on this page apply to waters open to fishing that DO NOT have special rules stating otherwise. Special Rules on individual waters begin on pages 20 and 34, Special Regulation Codes can be found on back cover flap.

LANDLOCKED SALMON, TROUT, TOGUE (LAKE TROUT) DAILY BAG & POSSESSION LIMITS





Lakes and Ponds:

- From April 1 September 30: Unless otherwise indicated under the appropriate county, open to open water fishing under general law fishing provisions (see page 18).
- From October 1 March 31: Unless otherwise indicated under the appropriate county, closed to open water fishing. Lakes and ponds with extended open water seasons will be indicated under the appropriate county.
- All lakes and ponds are closed to ice fishing, unless indicated with an A or B code, which defines the winter fishing season.

Rivers, Streams & Brooks:

- From April 1 August 15: Unless otherwise indicated under the appropriate county, open to open water fishing under general law fishing provisions (see page 18).
- From August 16 September 30: Fishing in rivers, streams and brooks is
 restricted to the use of artificial lures or flies only, and the combined total daily
 bag limit for trout, landlocked salmon, and togue is 1 fish.
- From October 1 March 31: Unless otherwise indicated under the appropriate county, rivers, streams and brooks are closed to all fishing. Any water open to open water fishing or ice fishing between October 1 March 31 will be indicated under the appropriate county.

Waters open to ice fishing are listed with an A or a B code which defines the winter fishing season. All other waters are closed to ice fishing.

LITTLE, Woodstock, Greenwood, West Paris, Paris, Oxford, Minot, Poland, Auburn, etc. S-19. S-33. From Route 26 Welchville Dam in Oxford to the confluence with Androscoggin River: Open to fishing from April 1 – October 31, S-19. From August 16 – October 31: River/ Stream/Brook General Law terminal gear regulations stated for April 1 – August 15 apply.

AUBURN LAKE AND TRIBUTARIES, Auburn. CI. No motor vehicles on ice (ATVs and snowmobiles allowed). S-1, S-26. Lake, tributaries and outlet to barrier dam closed to the

spearing of all fish. From October 1 -November 30: Lake only open to open water fishing, S-6, S-7. Lake, tributaries, and outlet to barrier dam closed to open water fishing from December 1 - March 31. The Auburn Water District has closed to all water-related activities (including boating and fishing) that portion southerly of a line extending from a marker placed on a point of land on the east shore of the lake approximately 400 feet southerly of the Route 4 boat launch and extending westerly to a marker on a point of land known as Point of Pines on the west shore of the lake. That portion northerly of the above described line is also closed to all water-related activities except that small recreational boats and fishing are allowed.

BARTLETT POND AND TRIBUTARIES AND OUTLET TO BARRIER DAM, Livermore. CI. S-1, S-3, S-4, S-10.

BASIN BROOK, Auburn. S-1, S-19. Closed to the spearing of all fish.

LARD POND, Turner. Motorboats over 10 horsepower prohibited.

LITTLE RIVER, Lisbon, Topsham, etc. S-33.

NEZINSCOT RIVER, Turner. From the Central Maine Power Company transmission line crossing approximately 500 yards below the junction with Martin Stream to the Turner Mill Dam: Open to ice fishing. S-6, S-19.

- From Turner Mill dam downstream to its confluence with Meadow Brook: Open to open water fishing for all fish from January 1 – December 31, S-6, S-7.
- From its confluence with Meadow Brook downstream to its confluence with the Androscoggin River: Open to open water fishing for all fish from January 1 – December 31, S-19. General Law terminal gear provisions and length limits apply year-round.

PETTINGILL PARK POND, Auburn. Open to fishing May 16 – September 30: S-9. Closed to all fishing October 1 – May 15.

PLEASANT POND, Turner. From October 1 – December 31: S-6, S-7.

RANGE POND, LOWER, Poland. Motorboats over 10 horsepower prohibited. From October 1 – December 31: S-6, S-7.

RANGE POND, MIDDLE, Poland. S-2, S-3, S-26. From October 1 – December 31: S-6. S-7.

RANGE POND, UPPER, Poland. From October 1 – December 31: S-6, S-7.

SABATTUS POND, Greene, Wales, Sabattus. S-28.

TAYLOR POND, Auburn. S-3.

THOMPSON LAKE (INCLUDING THE HEATH), Poland, Oxford, etc. (See Oxford County - Southern and Eastern Counties.)

COLD RAIN POND, Naples. From October 1 – December 31: S-6, S-7.

COLLYER BROOK, Gray. S-19.

CRESCENT LAKE, Raymond. From October 1 – December 31: S-6, S-7.

CROOKED RIVER, Albany to Casco, etc. (Cumberland and Oxford Counties): S-1, S-5, S-22; minimum length limit on landlocked salmon: 26 inches. October 1

PRESUMPSCOT RIVER (excluding North Gorham Pond and Dundee Pond), Standish, Windham, Gorham, Westbrook. Open to open water and ice fishing from January 1 – December 31.



Maine Boating Law Highlights

A person may not operate a motorboat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the state unless a Lake & River Protection Sticker is affixed to both sides of the watercraft. The fee is \$10 for boats registered in Maine, and \$20 for boats registered outside Maine.

Any watercraft equipped with machinery of any horsepower must be registered, including sailboats, canoes, dinghies and rowboats. The OPERATOR must have the valid registration certificate on board and available for inspection at all times the boat is in operation. NOTE: Before a boat can be registered, the owner must (1) submit proof that the excise tax has been paid to their town tax collector or that the boat is tax exempt, and (2) pay sales tax or use tax on all boats purchased from another person (casual sale). Assigned registration numbers, stickers and excise tax decals must be displayed on both side of the bow of the boat, in that order.

Boats validly registered in other states having a federally approved law can operate, for a period of 60 consecutive days, without licensing in Maine.

An operator of a boat of more than 10 horsepower must be at least 12 years of age unless under the immediate supervision of a person at least 16 years of age.

Children 10 years of age or under are required to WEAR a Type I, II or III PFD in all watercraft.

Craft less than 16 feet and all canoes, kayaks and stand-up paddleboards regardless of length, must carry at least 1 Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD), Types I, II, or III (wearable), for each person aboard. Watercraft 16 feet or longer must carry the above PLUS 1 Type IV (throwable) device immediately available in craft. See Maine Boat Law for requirements for carrying passengers for hire or other commercial purposes.

Boating accidents involving personal injury, death or property damage estimated at \$2,000 or more must be reported to a law enforcement agency by the quickest means possible.

Prudent and reasonable speed is required at all times; operation to endanger persons or property, in a reckless manner, or under the influence of alcohol or drugs, is prohibited. It is unlawful to engage in prolonged circling, informal racing, wake jumping or other types of continued and repeated activities that harass another person. This subsection may be enforced by any law enforcement officer or a person may bring a private nuisance action for a violation of the subsection pursuant to Title 17 Section 2802.

Watercraft operating between sunset and sunrise must display lights and carry such other safety equipment required by federal and state law

Water Safety Zone and Headway Speed: Watercraft MAY NOT be operated at greater than headway speed (speed necessary to maintain steerage and control) within the water safety zone (the area within 200 feet of the shoreline, whether the shoreline of the mainland or of an island) or within a marina or an approved anchorage in coastal or inland waters, except while actively fishing.

Maine has a tough OUI (operating under the influence) provision in its boating law.

Any pond 10 acres or less within Indian Territory is regulated by the Tribe in whose territory the pond is located. Open Water Fishing Season:

If there are no special length and/or bag limits listed within the Indian Territory Waters, then refer to statewide General Law length and bag limits on page 18.

Special rules that differ from General Law provisions are listed below for individual waters. Check the list of waters by county to determine if the water you wish to fish has special regulations. General Law regulations for fishing Indian Territory waters otherwise apply.

Note: All rivers, streams, and brooks in Indian Territory listed below are closed to ice fishing. Also closed to ice fishing are all rivers, streams, and brooks located in Passamaquoddy Territory in Penobscot County (T3 R9 NWP and TA R7 WELS) and Somerset County (Alder Brook, Pittston Academy, Soldiertown, and Hammond Townships); and in all rivers, streams, and brooks located in Penobscot Indian Territory in Penobscot County (Argyle and T3 R1 NBPP) and in Piscataquis County (Williamsburg).



WARNING ABOUT EATING FRESHWATER FISH

Mercury in Maine freshwater fish may harm the babies of pregnant and nursing mothers, and young children.

- Pregnant and nursing women, women who may get pregnant, and children under age 8 SHOULD NOT EAT ANY freshwater fish from Maine's inland waters. Except for brook trout and landlocked salmon, one meal per month is safe.
- All other adults and children older than 8 CAN EAT two freshwater fish meals per month. For brook trout and landlocked salmon, the limit is one meal per week.

Warning: Some Maine waters are polluted, requiring additional limits to eating fish.

Fish caught in some Maine waters have high levels of PCBs, Dioxins or DDT in them. These chemicals can cause cancer and other health effects. The Bureau of Health recommends additional fish consumption limits on the waters listed below. Remember to check the mercury guidelines. If the water you are fishing is listed below, check the mercury guideline above and follow the most limiting guidelines.

PREPARING FOR A CARVING

Plan ahead! Keep a soft tape measure and camera in your fishing gear. Take a few pictures of the fish to help record distinguishing characteristics and color. Measure the fish's length (from the center of the tail to the snout) all while handling the fish out of water as little as possible. Then follow the **Tips for Catching and Releasing Fish** on page 65.

The information is all that a carver needs to make a replica of the catch you made and the fish is available to be caught by another lucky angler.



Illegal Fish Introductions

The Largest Threat to Maine's Fish Populations and Fishing Heritage

In recent years Maine's lakes and rivers have experienced dozens of illegal fish introductions that pose real and immediate threats to our native fish populations and our traditional fisheries.

Unauthorized introductions of invasive, exotic fish species are particularly destructive to Maine's native fish species, especially brook trout populations. Introductions of invasive fish cause irreversible changes to entire aquatic ecosystems. Strategies to eliminate or control invasive fish are difficult to design and implement, costly, and are only effective in limited situations.

Recent news about strange South American fish (pacu) in Limestone, Maine or snakeheads in New York grab people's attention, but the spread of more commonly known species (largemouth bass, northern pike, rainbow smelt, black crappie) constitutes the greatest threat in Maine.

How widespread is this problem?

Since May 2006 approximately 100 new introductions have been documented by MDIFW fisheries biologists throughout the state.

Where do these introductions occur?

In the past the vast majority of introductions occurred in southern, central, and coastal Maine. In recent years invasive fish are being established at a higher rate in western and northern regions where most of Maine's wild brook trout and Arctic char populations are located.

When a non-native or invasive species is illegally introduced into a waterbody the following impacts can occur:

- 1. Prey upon existing fish species in that waterbody.
- 2. Compete with existing fish species for food and habitat.
- Spread to other waterbodies (upstream and downstream) that are connected to the original water. This expands the range of the new species and continues impacting other existing fish populations.
- 4. Increase the potential for fish diseases to be spread and for the introduction of new diseases from outside of Maine. Existing Maine regulations on the importation of live fish and health screening requirements for authorized transfers have prevented the spread of most fish diseases into Maine from neighboring states.
- Once an introduced fish species becomes established in a waterbody the fish community is FOREVER CHANGED!

What can you, the angler, do?

Properly dispose of unused bait. Always dispose of unwanted baitfish on land or in the trash. DO NOT release any live baitfish into a waterbody!

Anglers are strongly encouraged to harvest all northern pike, muskellunge, walleye, and black crappie and not release them back to the water alive.

Follow fishing regulations. Regulations that restrict anglers to fly-fishing only, artificial lures only, or preclude the use or possession of live fish are often intended to prevent the introduction of new fish species to sensitive areas of the state. Please follow all regulations in regards to the use of terminal gear (tackle) as stated in the fishing lawbook.

Report introductions. If you observe a person releasing live fish into a waterbody, gather any information on the person's description, boat hull number or vehicle license plate number if applicable. Report your observation by calling Operation Game Thief at 1-800-253-7887.

If you catch a fish species that you believe is not known to inhabit a waterbody take a picture and/or kill the fish and freeze it immediately and contact the nearest regional MDIFW Office (listed in the fishing lawbook).

Which species are most often introduced and the problems that they cause?

Largemouth bass – If a waterbody already contains smallmouth bass, largemouth bass commonly outcompete smallmouths reducing their overall abundance. If a trout stocking program is active in a waterbody that largemouth bass become established in, the bass prey upon the stocked trout. This decreases angler catch rates for trout and may prompt MDIFW biologists to stop stocking trout altogether if predation rates on stocked trout become unacceptably high. Introduced largemouth bass have also decimated baitfish populations in many waters, eliminating opportunities to harvest baitfish, both recreationally and commercially.

Northern pike – Pike introductions create a significant change to the fish population structure within a waterbody. They will prey upon any available forage species (smelt, shiners, fallfish, and perch) as well as game fish (bass, pickerel, and both wild and stocked trout and salmon species). This reduces the overall abundance of both forage and game fish, which has drastic impacts to anglers over time.

Muskellunge – Muskies negatively impact wild brook trout populations in Maine. Due to their preference for cool-water habitat muskie actively prey upon native minnow species and brook trout, while also pushing out brook trout from slow water habitat. This reduces the overall abundance of brook trout in ponds and rivers where muskie are present, which greatly reduces angler catch rates of trout over time.

Black crappie – Black crappie compete for forage with existing fish species when introduced to a waterbody. Due to their fast growth rates and high productivity, crappie can quickly become abundant. A unique life history trait exhibited by crappie is large-scale downstream movement of young-of-year fish. This allows for quick colonization of downstream waters.

Smallmouth bass – When smallmouth bass are introduced into waters with wild brook trout populations they prey upon the brook trout and compete with trout for food and available habitat. As the bass population becomes more abundant they will reduce or extirpate brook trout and spread into accessible waters upstream or downstream.

Landlocked alewife – Landlocked alewives compete with smelt populations, often reducing the abundance of smelt in a waterbody. This change produces a profound negative impact to landlocked salmon because smelt are the primary forage for landlocked salmon. Reduced smelt abundance decreases landlocked salmon growth and abundance, along with angler satisfaction.

Rainbow smelt – Smelt are common in many waters and are native to Maine. Though often used for bait, their introduction into wild brook trout ponds and small-sized Arctic char waters cause significant negative impacts to trout and char because adult smelt prey on the young of both species.

Why is it difficult to remove fish once introduced?

The removal of unwanted organisms from aquatic environments (water) is much harder to address compared to terrestrial environments (land). Special fishing regulations to limit population growth of an introduced species are generally ineffective over the long term. The use of rotenone to chemically reclaim a waterbody is highly effective, but its use is limited to smaller lakes and ponds due to the high costs and the impracticality of achieving complete removal in larger waterbodies with extensive tributary systems.

The illegal introduction of any fish into any Maine water is a Class E crime, punishable by fines up to \$10,000! The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is offering a minimum reward of \$2,000 for information leading to the apprehension of persons responsible for the illegal introduction of fish. Call Operation Game Thief at 1-800-253-7887.

PROPERLY HANDLING SOFT PLASTIC BAITS

Soft plastic baits are popular fishing tackle. Many discarded plastic baits are ending up on lake bottoms or in fish stomachs. Fish often ingest these baits off the bottom, and they may impact fish health.

You can do your part to make sure that plastic baits are handled properly. **Never discard or dump used soft plastic baits into the water!** Dispose of your used baits properly in a trash can. Keep an eye out for ReBaits® recycling canisters at several boat launches in southern and central Maine. Used plastic baits placed in ReBaits® collection canisters are recycled into new plastic baits and made available to kids fishing derbies for free.

Rc Baits®

The best thing you can do is inspect your soft plastic bait frequently. After catching a fish, make sure your bait is still intact. If your bait is worn and will likely fall off, replace it with a new bait, re-hook it or repair it.

You can also extend the useful life of your plastic baits quite easily. Use a small o-ring or cinched small zip-tie in the middle of the bait, and place your hook right under the o-ring or zip-tie. That way, if your hook pulls through the bait, the o-ring or zip-tie will help retain your bait.

Help ensure the health of future fisheries. Discarded soft plastic baits are trash. Please replace any worn baits while fishing and dispose of these baits properly.

3 WAYS TO DISPOSE OF YOUR SOFT PLASTIC BAITS

Don't throw your used soft plastic baits into the water! As mentioned elsewhere in this lawbook, bringing a small Ziploc bag to collect used baits until you get off the water is an excellent idea. But what happens when you get done fishing? Here are your top three options:

- Recycle canisters. There are bait recycle canisters located on a number of Maine lakes. These are similar to the line recycling canisters. Simply deposit your used soft plastic baits into these canisters at the end of the day.
- Local recycle programs. Check with your local fishing club or retailer to see if they are involved in a bait recycling program.
- Trash bin. If there isn't a bait recycle canister available, simply toss it in the trash.

You wouldn't throw your plastic water bottle overboard — don't toss your soft plastic baits, either.

GOOD FISHING DEPENDS ON CLEAN WATER

- Maintain septic systems
- Encourage your community to invest in its wastewater infrastructure



Muskellunge – Dark, vertical bars on light green or brown background.




Only upper half of cheek and gill cover scaled.

Chain Pickerel – Dark, chain-like markings on light background along flank, and a dark vertical line under eye.




Atlantic salmon are listed as endangered species by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and are considered a closed species by the State of Maine. To help protect them and ensure anglers do not inadvertently "take" an endangered


species through misidentification, the S-33 code was developed.

Atlantic Salmon occur in a variety of color phases from black to silver to brown, and can look similar to brown trout in coloration. Atlantic Salmon also occur in regions of the state not subject to the S-33 rule. Therefore, anglers should use caution and make proper identification any time a large Salmonid is caught. Any Atlantic salmon incidentally caught must be released immediately, alive and uninjured. At no time should Atlantic salmon be removed from the water.

IDENTIFICATION OF LANDLOCKED SALMON AND BROWN TROUT

The more obvious difference between landlocked salmon and brown trout may be found in the head and tail areas. Knowing them may help the angler release a fish more quickly when certain creel and size restrictions apply. On landlocked salmon, the vomerine teeth are small and arranged in a single row along the vomerine shaft, few to none on vomerine head. On brown trout, the vomerine teeth are well-developed on both vomerine head and shaft, arranged in a zig-zag row on shaft. On landlocked salmon, the caudal fin may be slightly forked and on the brown trout, the caudal fin is square and unforked.






& ANADROMOUS ATLANTIC SALMON



For current saltwater recreational fishing regulations, please visit the Maine Dept of Marine Resources (DMR) website at http://www.maine.gov/dmr/recreational/regulations.htm or call DMR at 633-9500.

It is unlawful to angle for, take, or possess anadromous Atlantic salmon from all Maine waters (including all coastal waters), unless otherwise permitted by DMR. If an Atlantic salmon is incidentally hooked it should not be removed from the water, and it should be released immediately.





Rainbow smelt:

- · Long, slender, and silvery
- Adipose fin present



Fathead minnow:

- First dorsal fin ray is short and thick
- Distinctive fat/flattened head shape
- Generally 2-2.5" in length



Creek chub:

- Similar to Lake Chub but with a dark spot at base of dorsal fin
- Upper jaw extends at least to below front of eye



Eastern silvery minnow:

- Silvery sides with some olive coloration on back
- · Lower jaw is crescent or banana shaped
- Somewhat similar in appearance to rainbow smelt, but adipose fin absent



Sucker (White and Longnose):

- Mouth points downward with thick lips
- Large scales
- · Adults can be over 22" in length



Northern redbelly dace:

- Two black lateral bands down body
- Males may exhibit bright red coloration on hellies
- Similar legal species include blacknose, longnose, pearl, and finescale dace



Common shiner:

- Deep bodies with a slightly downward curving lateral line (curved less deeply than the golden shiner)
- Scales on sides near the front of the body are obviously taller than they are wide
- Mature individuals may have red fins (also known as the "Redfin Shiner")



Lake chub:

- Similar in appearance to Creek Chub, but lacks a dot at the base of the dorsal fin
- Mature adults may have bright orange/red spots where the pectoral fins meet the body



Golden shiner:

- Deep flattened body with a strongly downward curving lateral line
- Large scales
- Sickle-shaped anal fin
- Fleshy "keel" (lacks scales) between the pelvic fins and anal fin

Please note: These are not the only legal baitfish species, only the more common ones. For a complete list of which species are legal to use as bait and which species are not legal to use as bait, please see baitfish restrictions on page 61.

IT IS ILLEGAL TO USE THESE FISH AS BAIT

When in doubt or if it cannot be identified, don't use it!



Brown bullhead (hornpout, catfish)



Anything in the pike, muskie, or pickerel family

Spiny rayed fish: Including but not limited to any

bass, sunfish, perch, crappie, or any other fish that has hard, spiny rays on their fins.



Any species not listed as legal baitfish: including but not limited to carp, rudd, goldfish, walleye, alewives, and sculpin.

IMPORTATION OF BAITFISH PROHIBITED

It is unlawful to import any live baitfish or smelts into Maine.

BAIT DEALER'S LICENSE

It is unlawful for any person to deal in live baitfish or live smelts without first obtaining a valid dealer's license. For further information, contact IF&W. (**Note:** A person may take live baitfish for their own use, by the use of hook and line or bait trap only, if that person holds a valid fishing license.)

MARKING HOLES

When using drop nets to fish through the ice for baitfish/smelts, all holes made in the ice **must be marked** either by evergreen boughs placed around the hole, or by suspending at least 1 strand of fluorescent biodegradable tape at least 3 feet above the ice around the entire perimeter of the hole so that the tape is visible from all sides.

STORING LIVE BAITFISH

Live baitfish may not be stored or held in any waters where the use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited during the entire ice fishing season or the entire open water fishing season. This includes waters restricted to the use of artificial lures only, waters restricted to fly fishing, and where there are other prohibitions on the use of live fish as bait. To obtain a list of Maine waters where baitfish cannot be stored please contact IFW's Augusta Office, or visit IFW's website: mefishwildlife.com.

TAKING OF BAITFISH FOR PERSONAL USE

- All waters are open to the taking of baitfish for personal use, including rivers, streams and brooks, unless designated "closed to the taking of live baitfish" (see special rules beginning on page 20).
- Any person with a valid Maine fishing license may take baitfish for their personal use.
- Baitfish taken are for personal use only and may not be sold without a bait dealers license.
- All baitfish traps and holding cages must be labeled with the owner's name and address.
- Baitfish traps may not exceed 50 cubic feet in volume.
- Baitfish traps must be tended at least once every 7 days by the person who set them.
- The following species are considered legal baitfish. Any species of fish <u>not listed</u> below, except smelt, may not be used as bait (live or dead) for fishing in inland waters. All other fish species must be immediately released alive into the water where they were captured.

• Always seek landowner permission before crossing private land to trap baitfish.

TROUBLE BY THE BUCKETFUL

That's what the illegal introduction of exotic species brings to Maine's waters.

Some thoughtless individuals are attempting to destroy the future of Maine's native fisheries. These nonsportsmen illegally stock the type of fish they prefer to catch, without regard for the environmental havoc they inflict on the resource. Illegal stocking selfishly denies the people of Maine the right to decide what is best for our waters.

Please help fight this serious problem.

- It is illegal to transport live fish without a permit except legal baitfish or smelts.
- It is illegal to dump unused baitfish into any waterway.
- There is a \$10,000 fine for a conviction of illegal stocking.
- Always keep your ears and eyes open for those who are committing these senseless acts.
- If convicted, the license revocation has increased from 1 to 5 years.

Conserving Maine's Wild Brook Trout

Maine is the nation's wild brook trout (Salvelinus fontinalis) resource leader. A national status assessment of the species' historic range, completed in 2005, found the greatest percentage of intact, viable wild brook trout populations occur in Maine. Maine is a leader in wild brook trout conservation and a founding partner of the Eastern Brook Trout Joint Venture: National Fish Habitat Partnership (www.easternbrooktrout.org). Our wild brookies persist statewide and can be found inhabiting all varieties of aquatic habitats – lakes, ponds, rivers, streams, and coastal estuaries. This provides anglers with ample year round options to experience a variety of fishing opportunities and angling styles while exploring Maine's diverse geography.

Maine's wild brook trout tend to be concentrated in the interior highlands of the state, an area dominated by vast forests. However, wild brookies are also common in lower elevation areas, the coastal plain, and in relative close proximity to development. All in all, recent survey efforts of all habitat types reveal that wild brook trout occupy about 60% of all habitats available to them within Maine. Because trout can be found in such diverse habitats and conditions, fish size and abundance is also quite variable. As such, IFW biologists vary management strategies across habitats and waters in order to provide a variety of options to anglers while conserving populations for future generations. Some

ponds that support high growth rates are managed to provide anglers an expectation of catching larger than average size trout. Conversely, some waters that tend to produce high abundances of trout are managed to provide anglers an expectation of 'faster fishing' or higher catch rates for smaller trout. Regulating Harvest

Some Management Techniques and Their Effects

In North America, fishing regulations were implemented well before the turn of the 20th century. For example, season closures for some marine fisheries were implemented as early as the 1600s and by the time of the American Revolution, numerous statutes were in place regulating fish harvest. Since the 1960s there has been a broad trend toward more restrictive harvest regulations including the reduction in the number of fish that can be harvested and the use of restrictive length limits. Additionally, water and species-specific regulations have become common throughout the United States. Whereas seasonal closures and creel limits were often the only regulations implemented at the turn of the 20th century, slot length limits and length-based creel limits are now used more widely to control harvest.

Fishing regulations are implemented for many reasons. In Maine, fishing regulations are implemented to improve fishing quality or to maintain population viability, to alter community dynamics, or to encourage the control of exotic species from certain waters. In addition, fishing regulations can be applied for public safety concerns, such as consumption advisories due to contaminants (e.g., lead, mercury, PCBs). Regulations may also be implemented for social reasons, such as accommodating the desires of individual user groups. Both social and biological data are used by our Fisheries Division when implementing or altering fishing regulations and policies. Suffice to say, developing, maintaining, and changing fishing regulations is no easy task! With any regulation, careful design and regular monitoring are essential in order to be effective.

If you've fished in Maine then you may recognize that state-wide there are a diversity of fishing regulations that all anglers must follow. Fishing regulations are as diverse as the people of Maine and are based on many factors, including the water body, location, water quality, species composition, and the desires of anglers. Below are some fisheries management techniques that we hope define and explain why certain regulations exist.

General Law: This regulation provides basic protection to stocked and wild fish. General law encourages early harvest where angler pressure is moderate to high which can maximize growth rate potential of individual fish not harvested in the fishery. This regulation can provide good catch rates and harvest opportunities

Low Bag Limits: Lower bag limits are intended to distribute the catch over a longer period of time and among more anglers. Low bag limits usually coincide with restrictive regulations such as high minimum length limits.

Slot Limits: These regulations are bound by the upper and lower length limits with the intent of directing harvest to specific parts of a fish population while protecting others. A slot limit may be used to "thin out" smaller fish to allow remaining fish to grow faster and enable large fish to be caught and released or kept. The protected size slot protects fish and allows them to continue to grow and reach a larger size class. Anglers are important with this regulation! Without harvesting fish of a given size, the regulation does little for management of the resource.

Catch and Release: This regulation is intended to return fish to the water alive, thus giving them the chance to grow larger and be caught again. This regulation may be effective on waters where natural recruitment and population size is very low and growth rates are excellent, or on waters where there is a strict need for conservation (imperiled or endangered species, for instance).

Fly Fishing or Artificial Lures Only: These "terminal tackle" regulations are applied to reduce mortalities in released fish and are often an effective and necessary companion to restrictive bag and length limits.

No Live Fish as Bait: This regulation is typically applied to reduce the risk of establishing unwanted bait populations in landlocked salmon or brook trout waters, while still allowing the use of dead baitfish or artificial lures.





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By carefully following these simple instructions, you can release your fish unharmed. If you enjoyed catching your fish, so will the next angler!

- Time is of the essence. Play and release the fish as quickly and carefully as possible. An exhausted fish may be too weak to recover. Please, do not "overplay" your fish!
- 2. **Important: Keep the fish in the water.**Minimize or eliminate the time your fish is out of the water as little as 30 seconds of air exposure can cause delayed mortality of released trout, or the fish may be subject to a "quick freeze" during the winter months.
- Always wet your hands when it comes time to handle the fish. Dry hands are much more likely to remove a fish's layer of slime that protects the fish from fungus, bacteria and parasites.
- 4. Photographing your fish can be stressful. Prepare for taking photos with your fish safely under the water surface. When lifting the fish out of the water, do it for 5 second intervals or less. Try to get the shot (within reason), but return your fish to the water for a rest between attempts.
- Be gentle. Keep your fingers away from the gills. Don't squeeze the fish. Please, never drag a fish onto the bank!
- 6. **Choose the right landing net.** Rubber nets are easier on the fish than traditional twine nets.

- 7. Remove the hook with small pliers or a similar type tool. If the hook is deeply embedded or in a sensitive area such as the gills or stomach, cut the leader close to the snout. Make an effort to use regular steel (bronzed) hooks to promote early disintegration. Do not use stainless or gold-plated hooks. Consider using barbless hooks, especially on "catch and release" waters.
- 8. To revive a fish once it is back in the water, hold it in a swimming position in the water until it is able to swim away.
- 9. Togue (lake trout) often have expanded air bladders after being pulled up rapidly from deep water. If the belly appears expanded, release the fish from the hook first, then gently press your thumb along the stomach near the paired belly fins and move it forward a few times to remove air from the bladder. Finally, proceed to revive and free the fish.

Inland Fisheries and Wildlife

Waters which have exceptions to the general law are listed by county. If the water you wish to fish is listed under the appropriate county, the special regulation codes (S-1 through S-33) and season date codes (A, B, Cl, CO) will direct you to the specific rules for that body of water. These specific rules will differ from general law or the provisions for Maine's Counties. In most cases, the exception will be one of the codes listed below and may affect only a portion of the regulations that govern that particular body of water. All other provisions of general law would apply. The codes are defined below:

SPECIAL REGULATION CODES FOR ICE FISHING AND OPEN WATER FISHING - (S-CODES)

- S-1: Closed to taking smelts.
- S-2: Closed to taking smelts, except by hook and line.
- S-3: Tributaries closed to taking smelts.
- S-4: Use or possession of live fish is prohibited. (The use of dead fish, salmon eggs, and worms permitted.)
- S-5: Fly fishing only.
- S-6: Artificial lures only.
- All trout, landlocked salmon, and toque caught must be released alive at once.
- S-8: Restricted to 2 lines per person.
- S-9: Open to fishing only for persons under 16 years of age or for persons holding an eligible complimentary fishing license. Restricted to two lines per person. Daily bag limit on trout: 2 fish.
- S-10: Remains open to open water fishing from October 1 - November 30: artificial lures only; all trout, landlocked salmon and togue must be released alive at once. Closed to open water fishing from December 1 - March 31.
- S-11: Open to fishing only for persons under 16 years of age. Restricted to two lines per person. Daily bag limit on trout: 2 fish.

- S-12: Reserved for additional options.
- S-13: No size or bag limit on bass.
- S-14: Daily bag limit on bass: 1 fish; all bass between 16 and 20 inches must be released alive at once.
- S-15: Daily bag limit on bass: 1 fish; no minimum length limit on bass; all bass between 12 and 20 inches must be released alive at once.
- S-16: Daily bag limit on trout 2 fish; minimum length limit: 12 inches, only 1 may exceed 14 inches.
- S-17: Daily bag limit on trout: 2 fish; minimum length limit: 10 inches, only 1 may exceed 12 inches.
- S-18: Daily bag limit on trout: 1 fish; minimum length limit: 18 inches.
- S-19: Daily bag limit on trout: 2 fish.
- S-20: All trout less than 6 inches and longer than 12 inches must be released alive at once.
- S-21: Daily bag limit on trout: 1 fish; minimum length limit: 14 inches.
- S-22: Daily bag limit on landlocked salmon:
- S-23: Minimum length on landlocked salmon: 16 inches.

- S-24: Daily bag limit on landlocked salmon: 3 fish; minimum length limit: 12 inches.
- S-25: Daily bag limit on togue: 1 fish.
- S-26: Daily bag limit on togue: 3 fish; minimum length limit: 14 inches, only 1 may exceed 18 inches.
- S-27: Daily bag limit on togue: 6 fish; minimum length limit: 14 inches, only 1 may exceed 23 inches.
- S-28: Daily bag limit on white perch: 25 fish.
- S-29: No bag limit on pickerel. From July 1 -September 30: artificial lures only; the minimum length on trout is 8 inches.
- S-30: Indian Territory Regulations. See pages 53-54.
- S-31: Boundary waters with New Brunswick. See page 51.
- S-32: Border waters with New Hampshire. See page 52.
- S-33: Maximum length on landlocked salmon and brown trout: 25 inches.

SEASON DATE CODES

- A: Open to ice fishing and open water fishing for all fish from December 1 - April 30.
- Open to ice fishing and open water fishing from January 1
- CI: Closed to ice fishing.
- CO: Closed to open water fishing from October 1 March 31.

(Note: Special rules may restrict the general law fishing provisions.)
